Directions to Covenant Harbor Retreat Center:

From Chicago: Take I-94 west to HWY 50. Follow 50 West about 26 miles into Lake Geneva. The Covenant Harbor entrance is one mile west of downtown on the left. The entrance is just before HWY 50 widens from two to four lanes.

From Rockford and I-39 North: Take I-90 west to HWY 43. I-43 east to Highway 50 exit (Delavan). Follow HWY 50 east to Lake Geneva. Just before you enter town, the Covenant Harbor entrance is on the right. The entrance is just before Highway 50 narrows from four to two lanes.

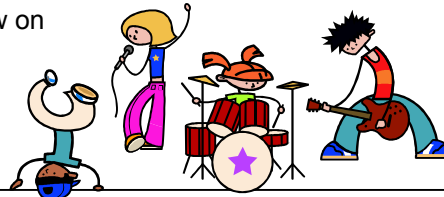
In Luke 24, on the road to Emmaus, there comes a time when the disciples' eyes were opened and they recognized Jesus.
